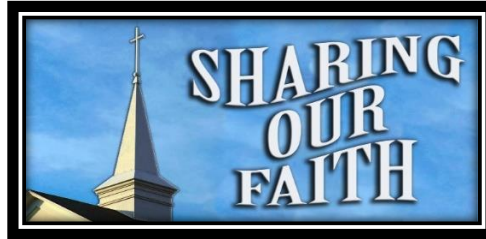

Recommended Reading: The Fifth Commandment - You shall not murder.

What does this mean? **We should fear and love God so that we do not hurt or harm our neighbor in his body, but help and support him in every physical need.**

Verse of the Week

Verse of the Week: Eph. 4:31-32

“31 Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice. 32 Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you.”

In our Gospel this week, Jesus tells the parable of the Good Samaritan. Clearly, physical acts of violence are easily connected back to the Fifth Commandment. If one were to stop with the physical it would not fully understand Jesus' point. Why? Because Jesus uses this extreme to open the door to our understanding that our neighbor is anyone in this world.

Our current culture is at war with itself about defining or redefining 'murder' or 'who our neighbor' is and even other questions such as when does life begin? Sadly, this is a war that has no winners. God sheds tears over this battle and Satan cheers it on, because it destroys relationships, credibility and even inflames people against one another.

Yet, Jesus answers this clearly with a four-letter word, love. **“We are to love our neighbor as ourself!”** Love overcomes all things and as Christians, this is exactly how we are to live, in love for one another. Paul understood this clearly and stated it emphatically when he wrote his letter to the Ephesians. Paul said in Ephesians 5, **“31 Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice. 32 Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you.”**

These are our marching orders and God's expectations of how we are to treat one another in the church and outside the church. Members and non-members alike, we are called to 'forgive', because **“God in Christ forgave”** us and sent His Son to die in order that we might have eternal life. And this is the gift God offers us out of His great love for us. This has been modeled for us by Jesus and we heard it first stated by Moses that we are empowered by God's love so **“We are to love our neighbor as ourself!”**

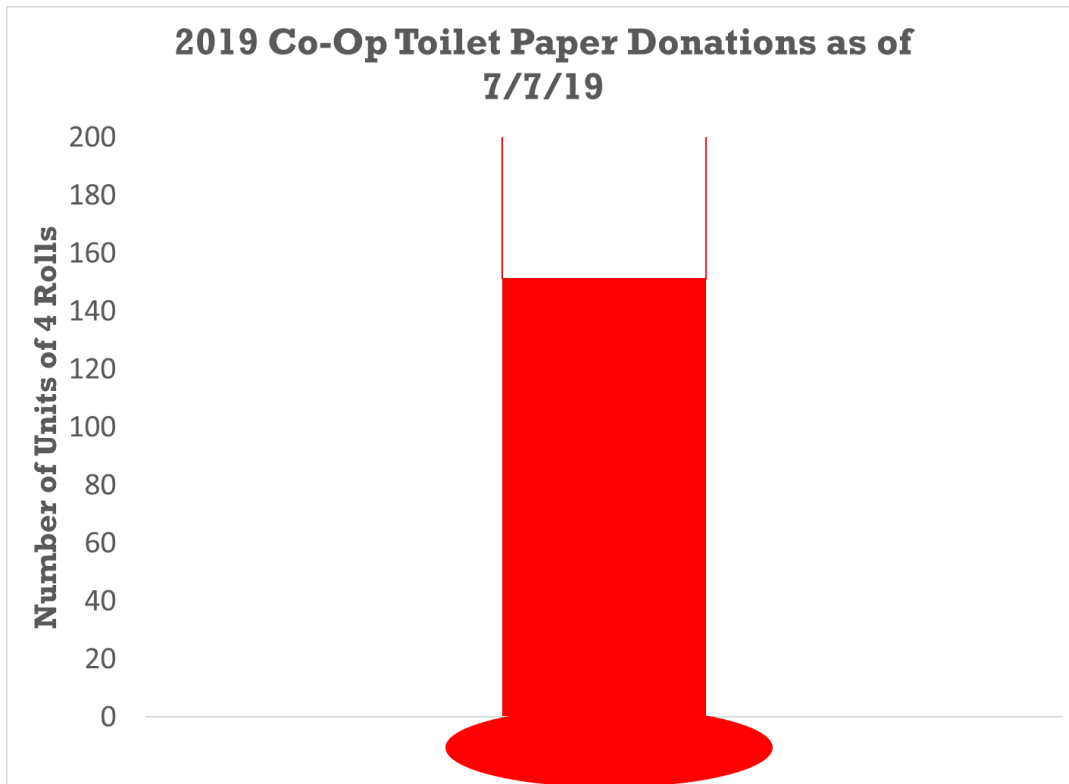
